Grant Recipient Organization	Grant Amount	Community Use
Acclaim Health	\$1,500	Grant supports a Care for Caregivers Workshop for 12-15 caregivers in Burlington
Big Brothers Big Sisters of Hamilton Burlington	\$1,500	This program provides quality mentoring relationships to children in need.
Burlington Central High School	\$1,500	Supports a 6-week international robotics program provides students with mentors to assist them in the design and fabrication of a robot.
Community Conflict Resolution Services of Halton	\$1,500	Grant supports material charges and operating costs that are needed to ensure free conflict resolution service and conflict resolution training to residents and organizations within Halton.
Compassion Society of Halton	\$20,000	This \$20,000 grant will support the operations of the organization to ensure the Compassion Society is able to continue providing desperately needed services of emergency clothing, food and social work services for vulnerable families in our community.
Danielle's place ED Support and Resource Centre	\$1,500	Grant supports Danielle's Place eating disorder educational and public awareness activities in Burlington during the current school year.
Equilibrium (Burlington) Supported by Equilibrium (Oakville)	\$1,500	This grant assists in supporting mental health education in the community by partnering with Wellington Square Friday Night Community.
Food For Life	\$20,000	This \$20,000 grant will support the hunger relief agencies in Burlington and will also support those accessing food when in need.

Food4Kids Hamilton & Halton	\$1,500	Food4Kids assembles packages of food containing kid friendly, non-perishable and easy to prepare meals with maximum nutrient value for kids who have little to no access to food during the summer months.
Halton Women's Place	\$15,000	This grant will serve the children and youth, who have been direct or indirect victims of domestic violence, either through witnessing abuse or being a direct victim of violence themselves.
Literacy Council of Burlington	\$1,340	The grant will assist with the purchase of desperately needed new and updated additional readers, books for writing skills and math resources as well as addressing costs associated with printing a vast quantity of new on-line activities, resources and quizzes.
Shifra Homes Inc	\$20,000	This grant will support their Residential and Seeds of Hope Program. Through the Residential Program, Shifra Homes' provides homeless teens with assistance during their pregnancy and subsequent months after delivery, as well as with the process of reintegration back into the community.
Tetra Society of North America	\$1,500	The Tetra Society designs, builds and installs custom assistive devices for children, teens, adults and seniors with a disability, in the City of Burlington, with no cost for labour. The grant will assist with the costs associated with parts, machining, welding, etc.
Tottering Biped Theatre	\$1,200	80% of Tottering Biped Theatre's administration for the company happens off a single laptop. To enhance efficiency in day to day administrative tasks, the grant went toward the purchase of a new laptop computer.
